

Shining the Light in Arizona: A Day of Prayer

Arizona Senate Bill 1070 is scheduled to go into effect Thursday, July 29. Tucson faith leaders are calling for a day of prayer. Pray for your neighbor. Pray for migrants. Pray for our elected officials. Pray for our city, our state, and our country.

Pray all night.

Everyone is invited to a prayer vigil at El Presidio Park, 160 W. Alameda, between City Hall and the Old Pima County Courthouse. The vigil will begin at 11:30pm Wednesday, July 28, and will continue until the morning. Stay for a few minutes or stay all night. All faiths are welcome.

Pray in the morning.

A multi-faith service of music and prayer will start at 7:00am on Thursday, July 29, at El Presidio Park. Tucson clerics from all faiths will lead prayers during this service.

Pray all day.

Many Tucson-area churches, synagogues, mosques, and temples will open their doors for prayer on Thursday, July 29. We urge you to join with people of faith to pray for wisdom, compassion, understanding, and peace. Call your house of worship for specific times.
